1. WHERE IT ALL BEGAN

Progress of the human civilization is essentially measured by the knowledge it acquires. Whether it is Francis Bacon emphasizing the importance 'Of studies' or T.S. Eliot harping on the 'historical sense' - the formalised dissemination of knowledge has always been the index of the cultural evolution and sophistication of any community. More than four decades ago, Champahati, Ghoshpur (then a remote village), saw a son of the soil, late Shri Bijoly Bhushan Kar awaken to this need for the spread of education in his native place. To that effect, he donated about one acre of his ancestral land for the establishment of a college, in memory of his father, Late Shri Sushil Kar. With the active and constructive support of like minded people like Late Doctor Durgapada Banerjee, Ex Head master Late Sushil Kumar Putatunda, Shri Ardhendu Adhikary, Late Dr. Tarapada Ghosh, Prof. Late Shri Sharat Ghosh, Shri Bidyut Sarkar, Shri. Bamandeb Majumdar, Late Dr. Bhabendranath Mondal, Late Bijoy Krishna Roy, Smt. Muktamala Kar among others, this visionary's dream materialised. On 5th Sept'1968, Sushil Kar College began its journey as a Co-educational undergraduate degree college under the affiliation of the University of Calcutta.

2. AIMS/OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

- To provide guidance to the students in the university curriculum with emphasis on creating awareness about the necessity of wide reading and reference work. To help the students explore their hidden potential in fields other than academics with the help of various co-curricular activities.
- To provide certain courses (like physical education, computer application etc.) which will equip the students further to carve a niche for themselves in the professional world.
- To provide financial assistance to the financially/economically backward students.
- To ultimately make a holistic approach towards the development of the young minds so that they can claim their space in the 'Sushil' (cultured, thinking, responsible) society, thus justifying the name of our college.

3. THE CAMPUS

Sushil Kar College combines the best of two worlds, as far as its location is concerned. Surrounded by shady trees, lush fields and beautiful ponds, the serene ambience is very conducive to the unhindered pursuit of studies. And yet, being on the outer fringes of Kolkata, the college is very well connected to the city both by rail and by road, facilitating mobility. The college is a mere 1.5 KMs away from 'Champahati', the nearest railway station, and regular auto, rickshaws and van service make the journey easily negotiable.

4. COLLEGE BUILDING

The college is made up of three self-sufficient buildings, on almost one acre of land, spread out on three corners of a big play ground. The academic block (comprising the classrooms, Professors' room, Library etc) and the block housing the health centre, students' union room, canteen, Defence Studies class rooms and laboratory are four-storeyed, while the administrative block (housing the Principal's room, College office, NSS Cell, NAAC Room, NCC Cell) is at present 3-storeyed. Expansion plans in all these three buildings and construction of a new science building are afoot.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

- i. Students who have obtained a minimum of 55% in subject, or 50% in aggregate along with 45% in subject, at the 10+2 level and have passed in English (a hundred marks paper) are eligible for applying for admission to the 1st year Hons. Class, subject to all C.U. rules.
- ii. Candidates who have passed the 10+2 level examination with five subjects of which at least one shall be English, having full marks of 450 (four papers of hundred marks each + one paper of 50 marks) are also eligible to apply.
- iii. For students qualifying from other Education Boards or Indian Universities, submission of migration certificate in original within one month from the date of admission in the college is compulsory. Otherwise his/her admission will be treated as cancelled.
- iv. Students who have discontinued their studies once and wish to take it up again will have to submit a recommendation letter from a responsible, established member of the society. Such a letter must clearly state the reason for the gap in education and vouch for the candidate's moral character.
- v. Separate application forms must be submitted for Honours and General Streams and the application fee must be deposited separately for each form.
- vi. For admission in B.A./B.Sc/ B.Com (Hons. & General) subjects, the students must have pass marks at the H.S. level in the subjects applied for.
- vii. For CHEMISTRY HONOURS: A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Chemistry if the student has passed in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- viii. For PHYSICS HONOURS: A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Physics if the student has passed in Physics and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- ix. To have Mathematics as a combination subject in BSc (H) and BSc(G) courses, the student must pass Mathematics at the 10+2 level.
- x. For Computer Science (CMSSG), the student must have pass marks in Mathematics and Physics/ Computer Science/ Computer Application at the H.S. level.
- xi. For Economics Hons. (ECOA), the student must have pass marks in Mathematics at the H.S. level.
- xii. Students applying for B.Com. courses must have passed Accountancy/ BO/ BEM/ Economics/ Mathematics/ Statistics/ Principles of Management.
- xiii. The merit list for honours students will be prepared on the basis of the aggregate of best four subjects. Marks of the compulsory subject Environmental Studies (ENVS) shall not be a valid subject to be considered in the Best of Four. However, marks for Environmental Science will be considered valid.
- xiv. For students applying for General courses the merit list shall be prepared on the basis of the Best of four subjects. Marks in ENVS as compulsory subject shall not be taken into account.
- xv. Candidates coming from vocational stream shall not be considered for admission.

Note: Last date of change of subjects/course stream is 25.08.2017

8. ATTENDANCE

Attendance at classes should be above 75% in each subject separately, and in no case should be below 60%. Students with lower percentage of attendance are not eligible to appear at the University examinations.

CASUAL STUDENTS

Students who fail to clear one or more subjects in the University examinations, can appear as casual students of the college. For this, they have to register their names in the office and pay registration fees





13. LIBRARY

- The Central library of the college is well stocked with text books, reference books, magazines and journals, which are arranged in separate shelves and almirahs, to facilitate easy access. The library has a reading room with a seating capacity of more than 50, a career counseling corner, display boards, computers with LAN and Internet facilities. It also has a book bank facility.
- A well furnished teachers' room is located adjacent to the Central Library in such a manner that students get easy and ready access to teachers.
- The Bengali department has a separate seminar hall cum departmental library. There are 4 other departmental libraries presently accommodated in the teachers' room and one department uses a separate space in the central library to house theirs.

14. OTHER ACADEMIC & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

To make learning more student-centric, student centered learning strategies like seminars, guest lectures, faculty exchange programmes are organized. Micro-teaching is a regular feature of the Honours classes which enables individual students to express their views freely on a particular topic. Self learning through internet, books and journals are encouraged. Teachers are encouraged to participate and organize seminars, workshops, major and minor research projects, faculty exchange activities, faculty development programme for completion of Ph.D. etc

N.C.C & N.S.S. CELL

The institution promotes institution-neighborhood-community network and student engagement, contributing to good citizenship, service orientation and holistic development of students through its N.S.S. and N.C.C. units.

Each year after the admission process is completed; notice is served to join in N.C.C. and N.S.S. The students are informed about the benefits that they can avail by joining N.C.C. /N.S.S. for their future employment in sectors like School Service Commission, Police, Army and Paramilitary Forces. Regular classes are taken by the teacher-in-charge of N.C.C. and the teacher-in-charge/ANO of N.S.S. units appointed by the Institution. The students and associated faculty actively participate in a number of social development works and surveys organized by the NCC and NSS units every year.

CAREER COUNSELING CELL

A career counseling cell has also been set up to provide proper guidance to students through various programmes and workshops. Programmes undertaken include Entrepreneurship Development Programme, Catering Management and Training Programme, Fishery Management Course. In addition to these various workshops were held in the college in association with the Directorate of Food Processing and Preservation, Directorate of Horticulture, Consumer Awareness Forum etc. Various linkages with industries and organizations are arranged to make the students acquainted with the job-market.

PRIZES/INCENTIVES

Financial incentives, Fee waivers etc are provided to meritorious students as well as students who participate and excel in sports activities and competitions.

SPORTS

The College holds Annual Sports in the month of February/March, Intra College Cricket and Football tournaments, Carrom competition as and when the classes are a bit slack. Students go to participate in State Level Athletic Meet every year.

SOCIAL & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The Cultural calendar of the college includes: The Freshers' Welcome in the month of August/September every year. Annual Social is held in the month of February/March every year. Apart from this, debates and elocution contests are occasionally held. Students from all streams actively participate in all these events.

MAGAZINES

An annual college magazine and wall magazines of various departments are published regularly to provide the platforms where students can express their creativity skill.

SMARTCLASSROOM FACILITY & LANGUAGE LAB

The college has smart classroom facility in four departments and English Language Lab facility with advanced ICT techniques.

MUTI-GYM

There is also a multi-gym unit under an instructor in the college. A separate room for the same has been provided in the ground floor of the Northern Block. There are two courses per year, each of six months duration.

HEALTH

There is a health care centre with a qualified doctor available in the campus at all times.

SC/ST CELL

All students belonging to SC/ST/OBC receive stipends from Govt. of West Bengal. In order to avail of the grant/stipend, students have to apply following stipulated timeframes.

STUDENTS' UNION

College has an active Students' Union that makes effective link between students and managements.

COMMON ROOM

There are two separate common rooms-one each for boys and girls with indoor game facilities.

CANTEEN

The college canteen serves hygienic food to all concerned in the college premises, at an affordable price.

RAILWAY CONCESSION

The students can avail of railway concessions by producing relevant documents at the college office.
